## Institute for Shock Physics Graduate Scholar Award

The Institute for Shock Physics is a multidisciplinary research organization within the College of Sciences with faculty participants from the Colleges of Sciences and Engineering and Architecture. The active involvement of the faculty in research, extensive experimental facilities, hands-on experience, and access to the DOE/NNSA National Laboratories (Lawrence Livermore, Los Alamos, and Sandia) provide a unique opportunity to graduate students. The close working relationships between graduate students and senior researchers allow mentoring and professional acquaintances that will grow beyond that of the typical classroom environment, which culminates into a mutually satisfying experience. Washington State University graduates in this field have moved on to successful professional careers.

The award is for one year (two academic semesters, plus summer) with annual renewals for students making satisfactory progress. Normally, the total duration of each award will be a maximum of 5 years. There are no teaching responsibilities associated with this award.
